

### ***PRS 5: How to run a PRS lesson quiz***

This will show you how to run a PRS lesson in a participatory mode (not self-paced) mode.


**Step 1:** Open up PRS and click on **Collect Responses**.



## PRS 5: Lesson Participation

**Step 2:** When the window opens, select **Participation** for *Type*.

**Step 3:** For *Lesson type*, put **Response Lesson**.




**Step 4:** Click on the **PRS Lesson** you want to initiate.
